UNIVERSITY COURSE CATALOG DESCRIPTION

Course designed for students having completed Haitian Creole 1 course. Emphasis on oral Haitian Creole and on acquiring language skills at the intermediate level.

COURSE OVERVIEW

Haitian Accelerated Intermediate Haitian Creole is designed to help students develop their speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills in Haitian Creole at the intermediate level. Students will engage in different communicative tasks in order to stimulate learning. Additional cultural and grammatical notions will be explored in relation to the lessons introduced in class.

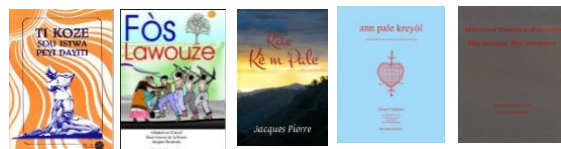
COURSE OBJECTIVES
